Enableness positions itself to lead Canada's growing fiber-to-the-home market

Company recognized by Branham 300 as Top Mover and Shaker for 2010

Ottawa, Canada – April 20, 2010 Enableness Technologies Inc. ("Enableness" or the "Company") (TSX-V: ENA), a leading supplier of fiber-to-the-home (FTTH) equipment for triple-play residential and business services and optical components and subsystems for access, metro and long-haul markets, is expanding its commitment to the domestic market with the hire of a sales and marketing veteran with 20 years of experience in the telecom space to serve as its first dedicated Regional Sales Manager (RSM) for Canada.

Over the past several years, Enableness has emerged as a Canadian success story, building a global business as a provider of vertically integrated FTTH solutions across North America and abroad with its award winning Multi Media Aggregation Node (MAGMN) and TRIDENT7 broadband access platforms.

While other markets have proceeded with FTTH deployment at a faster rate than Canada, Enableness has nonetheless established a strong domestic customer base among small and mid-sized telcos. The company has noted a growing interest among a broader swath of the market, including incumbent carriers, to transition from their traditional copper and hybrid-coaxial networks to take advantage of the future-proof capabilities and near unlimited bandwidth that only fiber can provide.

To take advantage of this emerging market opportunity, 20-year industry veteran Biagio DiBattista has joined Enableness as its first dedicated RSM for the Canadian market.

DiBattista's proven track record spans data, voice and video services in the telco, cable, utility and large enterprise markets in both Canada and the U.S. He has built and led multi-million-dollar accounts for the likes of Bell, AT&T, fONOROLA and Nortel Networks, as well as smaller players such as Axiowave, BigBand Networks and LightRiver Technologies.

"Biagio has the proven ability to open markets, develop a business and grow a team that is aligned with both our corporate objectives and the needs of our customers," said Tim Thorsteinson, CEO of Enableness. "He is a welcome addition to our team who we expect will significantly grow our Canadian business."

Market mover and shaker

Enablence’s expanded commitment to the Canadian market comes at the same time that it has been recognized in the Branham300 – an annual ranking of Canada’s top 300 technology companies by Ottawa’s Branham Group, a leading “go to market” consultancy focused on the technology sector.

In the 2010 ranking, Enablence jumped 209 positions to 89th spot and also placed first on the lists of Top Movers and Shakers and Top 10 Growth Companies due to its impressive revenue growth in 2009 – 1,335 per cent.

“The Ottawa-based company underwent significant change during its 2009 fiscal year, integrating three firms it acquired in 2008 into its operations, while also maintaining its focus on building out its sophisticated product line with a significant percentage of its revenues (37 per cent) allocated to research and development activities,” read the report from Branham that appears in this month’s issue of Backbone Magazine.

“There is a huge market opportunity before us here in Canada and abroad,” said Thorsteinson. “We are privileged to be recognized by the Branham300 and are working hard to earn this distinction again next year.”
